

OFFICIAL GENERAL ELECTION BALLOT

NOVEMBER 7, 2000

1. To vote for a person whose name is printed on the ballot, fill in the oval in the first-choice column to the right of the name of the person.
2. For State and Federal offices you may also indicate a second or third choice, in case your first-choice candidate is eliminated in a runoff, by filling in a circle in the second or third-choice column to the right of the first-choice oval.
3. Marking a second or third choice cannot help defeat your first-choice candidate.
4. To vote for a person not listed on the ballot, write the candidate's name on the line provided AND fill in the appropriate oval or circle.

- C. To vote for a person whose name is not printed on the ballot, write the candidate's name on the line provided AND complete the arrow.
- D. If you wrongly mark, tear or deface the ballot, return it to an election official and obtain another.
