I am executive director of FairVote - The Center for Voting and Democracy, a non-profit, non-partisan organization promoting free and fair elections. I had an important request.

Our Right to Vote Initiative program's Ryan Griffin is coordinating creation of a comprehensive public on-line resource on election administration and electoral reform in all fifty states, plus the District of Columbia and the U.S. territories. We believe this resource will be the first of its kind. It will contain information on: the office or offices responsible for overseeing elections; the election or appointment process for each office; and background on the current officeholders and announced candidates for the office, if to be elected by 2006.
