 - 13. VOTE BY A PROVISIONAL BALLOT IF:
- (a) YOUR NAME IS NOT ON THE PRECINCT REGISTER AND YOU BELIEVE YOU ARE QUALIFIED TO VOTE.
- (b) YOU HAVE MOVED WITHIN A COUNTY BUT HAVE NOT NOTIFIED THE COUNTY RECORDER'S OFFICE OF YOUR NEW ADDRESS.
- (c) YOU REQUESTED AN EARLY BALLOT BUT YOU HAVE NOT VOTED AND WILL SURRENDER THE BALLOT AT THE POLLING PLACE ON ELECTION DAY.
 - (d) YOU HAVE CHANGED YOUR NAME.
- (e) YOUR ELIGIBILITY TO VOTE IS CHALLENGED AT THE POLLS. BEFORE VOTING BY PROVISIONAL BALLOT YOU MUST SHOW IDENTIFICATION WITH YOUR NAME AND CURRENT ADDRESS OR SIGN AN AFFIRMATION STATING THAT YOU ARE ELIGIBLE AND REGISTERED TO VOTE IN THE PRECINCT.
- MAKE SURE YOU ARE IN THE CORRECT PRECINCT FOR YOUR CURRENT ADDRESS BEFORE YOU CAST A PROVISIONAL BALLOT. IF YOU ARE IN THE WRONG PRECINCT, THE POLL WORKER MUST DIRECT YOU TO THE CORRECT ONE.

- 14. TAKE YOUR MINOR CHILD INTO THE VOTING BOOTH WITH YOU WHILE YOU VOTE. (ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES SECTION 16-580)
- 15. RECEIVE ASSISTANCE WITH CASTING A BALLOT IF YOU ARE UNABLE TO READ OR WRITE OR HAVE A DISABILITY. YOU MAY RECEIVE ASSISTANCE FROM ANYONE YOU CHOOSE OR FROM TWO ELECTION OFFICIALS, ONE FROM EACH MAJOR POLITICAL PARTY. YOU MAY NOT RECEIVE ASSISTANCE FROM A CANDIDATE FOR THAT ELECTION, YOUR EMPLOYER OR AN AGENT OF YOUR EMPLOYER. (ARIZONA REVISED STATUTES SECTIONS 16-580 AND 16-1012)

Sec. 3. Section 16-563, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read: 16-563. Posting sample ballots, instruction cards and notices to voters before opening polls

Before opening the polls the inspector of election shall direct the following postings:

- 1. One of the sample ballots provided for in section 16-510, one of the cards of instructions provided for in section 16-513,— and one of the "Right to vote a provisional ballot" "VOTERS' BILL OF RIGHTS" notices provided for in section 16-513.01 in plain view in the room where the ballots are cast. At least one other sample ballot, card of instruction,— and "Right to vote a provisional ballot" "VOTERS' BILL OF RIGHTS" notice shall be posted in a conspicuous place in and around the polling place.
- 2. Three seventy-five foot limit notices approximately seventy-five feet in different directions from the main outside entrance being used by voters to enter the building in which the election is being held.
- 3. In each voting booth, a notice to voters provided in section 16-514 at general elections only.
 - Sec. 4. Section 19-123, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read: 19-123. Publicity pamphlet; printing; distribution; public hearings
- A. When the secretary of state is ordered by the legislature, or by petition under the initiative and referendum provisions of the constitution, to submit to the people a measure or proposed amendment to the constitution, the secretary of state shall cause to be printed, at the expense of the state, except as otherwise provided in this article, a publicity pamphlet, which shall contain:
- 1. A true copy of the title and text of the measure or proposed amendment. Such text shall indicate material deleted, if any, by printing such material with a line drawn through the center of the letters of such material and shall indicate material added or new material by printing the letters of such material in capital letters.
- 2. The form in which the measure or proposed amendment will appear on the ballot, the official title, the descriptive title prepared by the secretary of state and the number by which it will be designated.
 - 3. The arguments for and against the measure or amendment.
- 4. For any measure or proposed amendment, a legislative council analysis of the ballot proposal as prescribed by section 19-124.
- 5. The report of the commission on judicial performance review for any justices of the supreme court, judges of the court of appeals and judges of the superior court who are subject to retention.
- 6. The summary of a fiscal impact statement prepared by the joint legislative budget committee staff pursuant to subsection D of this section.

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7. A COPY OF THE "VOTERS' BILL OF RIGHTS" NOTICE PRESCRIBED IN SECTION 16-513.01.

- B. The secretary of state shall mail one copy of the publicity pamphlet to every household that contains a registered voter. The mailings may be made over a period of days but shall be mailed in order to be delivered to households before the earliest date for receipt by registered voters of any requested early ballots for the general election.
- C. Sample ballots for both the primary and general elections shall include a statement that information on how to obtain a publicity pamphlet for the general election ballot propositions is available by calling the secretary of state. The statement shall include a telephone number and mailing address of the secretary of state.
- D. On certification of an initiative measure as qualified for the ballot, the secretary of state shall hold or cause to be held at least three public meetings on the ballot measure. Hearings shall be held in at least three different counties and shall be held before the date of the election on the measure. The hearings shall provide an opportunity for proponents, opponents and the general public to provide testimony and request information. Hearings may be scheduled to include more than one qualified ballot measure and shall include a fiscal impact presentation on the measure by the joint legislative budget committee staff. The joint legislative budget committee staff shall prepare a summary of the fiscal impact for each ballot measure, not to exceed three hundred words, for publication in the publicity pamphlet.

Sec. 5. Section 41-121, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended to read: 41-121. Duties

The secretary of state shall:

- 1. Receive bills and resolutions from the legislature, and perform such other duties as devolve upon the secretary of state by resolution of the two houses or either of them.
 - 2. Keep a register of and attest the official acts of the governor.
 - 3. Act as custodian of the great seal of this state.
- 4. Affix the great seal, with the secretary of state's attestation, to public instruments to which the official signature of the governor is attached.
- 5. File in the secretary of state's office receipts for all books distributed by the secretary of state and direct the county recorder of each county to do the same.
- 6. Certify to the governor the names of those persons who have received at any election the highest number of votes for any office, the incumbent of which is commissioned by the governor.
- 7. Publish slip laws of each act of the legislature promptly upon passage and approval of such act, make such acts available to interested persons for a reasonable fee to compensate for the cost of printing and provide each house of the legislature and the legislative council with a

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certified copy of each bill or resolution, showing the chapter or resolution number of each, as each is filed in the secretary of state's office.

- 8. Keep a fee book of fees and compensation of whatever kind and nature earned, collected or charged by the secretary of state, with the date, the name of the payer and the nature of the service in each case. The fee book shall be verified annually by the secretary of state's affidavit entered in the fee book.
 - 9. Perform other duties imposed on the secretary of state by law.
- 10. Report to the governor on January 2 each year, and at such other times as provided by law, a detailed account of the secretary of state's official actions taken since the secretary of state's previous report together with a detailed statement of the manner in which all appropriations for the secretary of state's office have been expended.
- 11. Transfer all noncurrent or inactive books, records, deeds and other papers otherwise required to be filed with or retained by the secretary of state to the custody of the Arizona state library, archives and public records.
- 12. Make available to the public, without charge, title 33, chapter 11 on the secretary of state's web site WEBSITE.
- 13. Accept, and approve for use, electronic and digital signatures that comply with section 41-132, for documents filed with and by all state agencies, boards and commissions. In consultation with the government information technology agency, the department of administration and the state treasurer, the secretary of state shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 6 of this title establishing policies and procedures for the use of electronic and digital signatures by all state agencies, boards and commissions for documents filed with and by all state agencies, boards and commissions.
- 14. Meet at least annually with personnel from the federal voting assistance office of the United States department of defense and with county recorders and other county election officials in this state to coordinate the delivery and return of registrations, ballot requests, voted ballots and other election materials to and from absent uniformed and overseas citizens.
- 15. POST IN A PROMINENT PLACE ON THE SECRETARY OF STATE'S WEBSITE THE "VOTERS' BILL OF RIGHTS" NOTICE PRESCRIBED IN SECTION 16-513.01.

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
